Weather: The temperature outside is changing and students should dress appropriately including wearing a vest or a jacket to go outside and to come to school. We go outside every day at a.m. and p.m. recess and lunch hour unless in extreme weather conditions, wearing appropriate clothing is therefore very important.

Fire Drills: We had our first successful fire drill practice on Wednesday, October 2 with the fire department and will have two more throughout October and November. We encourage you to do evacuation practices at home with your children so they know what to do in case of a real emergency situation.

Repair and Damage Policy 2019-20. Knowlton Academy Cycle 3/Secondary 1: ETSB is no longer offering parents insurance for our Cycle 3 and Secondary 1's Chromebooks. Each school is now charged at the beginning of the year based on the previous years cost and student population. ETSB has decided that each school's Governing Board will set a maximum amount for damage, breakage, loss. At our Governing Board of September 30, it was decided that for unintentional damage, the maximum to parents would be one third of the repair cost. In the case of willful damage, the maximum charge would be half of the repair cost.

<u>Student Illness</u>: When a student is ill at school. He/she may call home from the classroom but MUST be signed out at the office by the adult picking them up before leaving. It is critical that there are working emergency phone numbers (parent and at least one other) in case of illness, accident, school closing, etc.

Lice: As a reminder, please check your child's head regularly for any signs of lice.

Fall Fun Day: Thursday, October 31 in the afternoon. Come check out the deals on toys, games and books. Do your fall clean-up and donate to the school! Profits go to the purchase and maintenance of ski equipment for the KA Ski Program, now in its 50th year!

Passion Days: This year, we will be trying passion blocks with our students once a month. Everyone will get to sign up for an activity from a list of staff's passions. What fun!

Sports News: KA Athletics again hosted the first ETEAA event of the calendar with our annual Cross-Country; it was held, on September 25th, at Lion's Park. Some 73 KA students attended after almost 3 weeks of training. They proudly wore their purple t-shirts/black shorts and did very well representing KA: girls in Class 2, 3 and 4 won banners while Jasmine Mierzwinski, Claire Simard, Evan and Jayleen Flores-Lavigne, Jada Manson, Maggie Labelle and Colton Richardson climbed on the podium for some medals. For the second year in a row, Sutton won top honours going home with the Hamilton Cup as Overall Champion. Some 514 students from 8 schools participated; congratulations to all!

Several students, based on their good preparation and results at the ETEAA XC were invited to the RSEQ Regional XC Championship, to be held in Longueuil on Saturday, October 19th. On Thursday, October 10th, at Lion's Park grade 2-3-4 students will play 5-a-side soccer, coached and reffed by Secondary 1 & Grade 6 students.
